Examination Rules and Instructions

Warning: Failure to observe the following rules will result in severe penalties including cancellation of your paper.

Preparing for your examinations

When preparing for your examinations, find out what to expect in the examination room and the examination paper, including where to write your answers. For each course you are studying, know the rules and requirements, what to bring and what to expect in each examination.

Read your examination timetable carefully and arrive at each of your examinations at least 20 minutes before the scheduled start time. The timetabled examination starting time is when reading time begins.

You need only attend school at those times that you have an examination.

All students are expected to be at each of their examinations on time. If a student arrives 15 minutes or more after the scheduled start time of the examination, they will not be permitted into the examination room without permission from a Deputy Principal or the Principal. Students who arrive more than 15 minutes after the scheduled start time of the examination must report to a Deputy Principal or the Principal.

Students may study in the Library Annexe on days/mornings/afternoons when they do not have examinations. Students will need to sign in/out through the Front Office and with Ms Tierney to register their presence on the school premises and wear full school uniform.

In the examination room:

You must be in school uniform for all examinations. All examinations will be undertaken in the Hall unless you are specifically advised otherwise.

Leave bags in an area indicated by the Examination Supervisor.

Remain quiet at all times while in the examination room. Cheating and/or malpractice compromises fairness for all students. Alleged cheating and/or malpractice will be investigated carefully and responded to as per NESAs and school assessment policies and penalties. This process involves a consideration of evidence and an interview with the student, his or her parent/s and the Deputy Principal. Cheating and/or malpractice will result in a mark of zero for that examination.

Disruption of the examination environment will not be tolerated under any circumstances. Any student found to be disruptive in the examination room will be dealt with under the guidelines of the Suspension and Expulsion Policy.

Sit in the seat allocated to you. Do not change places or move furniture.

No one may leave an examination once it has started. All students must remain until dismissed by the Examination Supervisor.

If you require assistance raise your hand and wait for a Supervisor.

Supervisors are not permitted to explain questions or give advice on answers.

Illness/Misadventure:

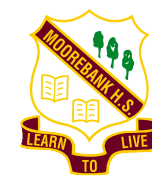
You must sit for all your examinations at the scheduled time. If you miss an examination, you or your parent must ring the school on the day of the examination on ph. 9601 3999 and ask to speak with Mrs Leong to explain the circumstances. You may then be asked to complete an Illness/Misadventure Form. If you miss an examination, you will be required to complete a supplementary examination (for regular written tests) or the original examination (for oral, performance or aural/listening assessments) at a time to be advised by Mrs Leong. Your result for a rescheduled oral, performance or aural/listening component assessment will be used along with results in previous assessments of the same skills to formulate an estimate for the missed examination component of that course. Failure to contact Mrs Leong on or before the day of the missed examination is very likely to result in a mark of zero for that examination.

An Illness/Misadventure claim must include clear and specific documented evidence for consideration by the Senior Assessment Committee and Deputy Principal. Illness/Misadventure claims must be lodged with Mrs Leong later on the day of the missed examination, or as soon as possible thereafter.

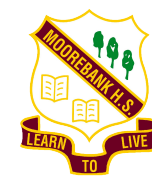
